Dear Mr. Malik Imtiaz Sarwar,

I have again review all the pertinent informations supplied to me in the past months and would like to offer my opinion :

1. I agree with the two forensic pathologists who jointly conducted the autopsy that some injuries are not compatible with injury sustained in the fall from height. That means the victim may have pre-fall injuries before falling.

- The scratches on the left shoe may have been caused by dragging.
- The anal injury was not compatible with fall from height, it was more of penetrating injury in nature.
- There were contusion at the site of ankle fracture despite the pathologist's opinion that the victim landed on his feet.
- Due to the less than perfect picture resolution, I cannot exclude manual strangulation on the neck.
- The pathologist's conclusion that the skull fracture was caused by the referred force from the feet landing but should it be liner fracture like this.

2. Among the autopsy findings that were compatible with fall from nine floors is the ladder lung.

3. As to the range of the time of death.

The pathologists arrived at the scene at about 6.40 p.m. and noted the present of rigor mortis at about 7.15 p.m., so the estimate time of death would be around 8-12 hours earlier (6-8 a.m.)
